### SECTION 2 — HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

Hazard class: Acute toxicity, oral and inhalation (Category 2). Fatal if swallowed or inhaled (H300+H330). Do not eat, drink or smoke when using this product (P270). Do not breath dust or fumes (P260).

Hazard class: Acute toxicity, dermal (Category 1). Fatal in contact with skin (H310).

Hazard class: Specific target organ toxicity - repeated exposure (Category 2). May cause damage to the kidneys, blood, liver, nerves, bones, and spleen through prolonged or repeated exposure if inhaled, ingested, or absorbed through the skin (H373).

Hazard class: Hazardous to the aquatic environment, acute and chronic toxicity (Category 1). Very toxic to aquatic life with long lasting effects (H410). Avoid release to the environment (P273).

### SECTION 4 — FIRST AID MEASURES

Immediately call a POISON CENTER or physician (P310).

**If inhaled:** Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing.

**If in eyes:** Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses if present and easy to do so. Continue rinsing.

**If on skin:** Gently wash with plenty of soap and water (P302 + P350).

**If swallowed:** Rinse mouth. Call a POISON CENTER or physician if you feel unwell.

### SECTION 5 — FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Noncombustible solid.

When heated to decomposition, may emit toxic fumes.

**In case of fire:** Use a tri-class dry chemical fire extinguisher.

### SECTION 6 — ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Restrict unprotected personnel from the area. Do not allow solid to become airborne. Ventilate area. Sweep up the spill, place in a sealed bag or container, and dispose. Wash spill site after material pickup is complete. Avoid dust formation. See Sections 8 and 13 for further information.

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**SECTION 7 — HANDLING AND STORAGE**

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Flinn Suggested Chemical Storage Pattern: Inorganic #2. Store with acetates, halides, sulfates, sulfites, thiosulfates and phosphates. Moisture and light sensitive. Store in a cool, dry place away from light. Store in a poisons cabinet. Keep container tightly closed (P233). Use only in a hood or well-ventilated area (P271).

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**SECTION 8 — EXPOSURE CONTROLS, PERSONAL PROTECTION**

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Wear protective gloves, protective clothing, and eye protection (P280). Wash hands thoroughly after handling (P264). Use only in a hood or well-ventilated area (P271). Wear respiratory protection (P284).

Exposure guidelines: PEL 0.1 mg/m<sup>3</sup> (OSHA); TLV 0.025 mg/m<sup>3</sup> (ACGIH) Readily absorbed through the skin.

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White, crystalline powder. Faint odor.

Soluble: Acids. Decomposes in water. Insoluble in alcohol.

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When heated to decomposition, emits toxic fumes of Hg. Avoid contact with strong oxidizers.

Shelf life: Good, if stored properly.

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Acute effects: Highly toxic, corrosive
